A Visiting Professor at the Spitzer School of Architecture for Spring 2012, **Ann Beha** FAIA of Ann Beha Architects, earned her master’s in architecture from MIT. She was a Loeb Fellow at Harvard’s Graduate School of Design. Her firm focuses on cultural, academic, and civic clients, re-envisioning historic and significant buildings, deploying them for new uses, and recasting their public identity. The firm’s projects have earned awards for design and for the preservation of cultural resources.
